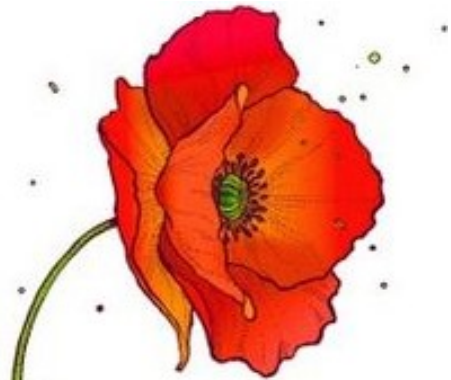


O, Canada !
